#### GENERAL INFORMATION

The Framingham Chess Club meets every Tuesday night at 7:00 PM, in the spacious American Legion hall at the intersection of Franklin and Beech Streets in Framingham. Annual membership is \$20; \$10 for juniors and seniors. Sixmonth and family memberships are also available. After two visits, non-members are requested to pay a weekly charge of 75¢ unless playing in a tournament with a differential entry fee. Non-members should sign the club logbook at the door. #### EVENTS IN 1984

Attached is a schedule of events at the Framingham Chess Club in 1984. The schedule includes both Tuesday and weekend events, USCF-rated tournaments, team matches, instructional activities, and fun events such as simultaneous exhibitions and speed tournaments. Further details and additional announcements will be published in The Pawn Storm, the Framingham Chess Club journal.

#### ONGOING EVENTS AND SERVICES

Pyramid Tournament: An informal pyramid tournament will always be in progress at the club. Players may enter this tournament at any time, playing or skipping any week they wish. Players challenge one another to defend their place in the pyramid and move up or down in the standings according to their results. Competition is organized on a quarterly basis, with a winner declared every 13 weeks. Games may be either rated or unrated. Complete details are available at the club

Other Informal Games and Tournaments: Should a player not wish to participate in the event scheduled for a particular evening nor enter the pyramid tournament, he is nonetheless welcome to drop by and play an informal, offhand game. Current USCF members may have their offhand games rated for a processing fee of 25¢ per game. Should a group of players wish to play a small tournament among themselves, this can readily be arranged by the tournament director. This is especially encouraged for novices, who may not wish to plunge directly into full-scale tournament play.

Problem-Solving Competition: Every week at the club a problem will be displayed on the demonstration board. Players may submit solutions to gain points in an ongoing competition, with winners to be announced every 13 weeks.
