The 2nd Annual Framingham Open will conclude Sunday evening, September 30, with a two-hour lecture at 5 PM by International Grandmaster Boris Spassky, followed by a 25-board simultaneous exhibition by Spassky at 7:30 PM.

Spassky, World Chess Champion from 1969 until his defeat by Bobby Fischer in their historic 1972 match, remains today one of the world's foremost Grandmasters, and one of the ten highest-rated players of all time. Long noted for his outspoken criticism of Soviet chess authorities, Spassky plunged back into the headlines recently with his declaration that he would no longer play under the Soviet flag.

ADMISSION

Lecture (5 PM): \$10 (\$8 for Billerica and Framingham Chess Club members and Framingham Open players; Exhibition participants free.)

Simultaneous Exhibition (7:30 PM): Board fee \$50 (\$45 for Billerica and Framingham Chess Club members). Only 25 boards available--reserve early!

Spectators at Exhibition: \$5 (\$3 for players under 18, Framingham Open players, and members of the Billerica and Framingham Chess Clubs. Lecture participants free.)

DIRECTIONS
