NM Lou Mercuri lectured again last night, covering N vs P endings from the basics of how to stop a single passed pawn with just a knight to more complex subtleties of knight vs. pawn endings. I think that many of the lower rated players are getting a lot out of the course, as many comment on how they had not previously thought about the principles

and ideas that we're covering. Next month Lou will not be lecturing, and we will be

covering N+P vs N+P endings, probably one of the most difficult topics of the course. It will be interesting to see if attendance is down again next month. It would be interesting to understand what effects attendance: difficulty of material, presence of Lou, cold
