COMMUNITY :: Game Collection

The MetroWest Chess Club's games collection has been updated! It now contains **551 games**, an increase of 51 since the collection was last updated in April. Thanks to all the players who have turned in their score sheets this year. You may contribute a game by placing your scoresheet in the labeled bin on the wall to the right of the posted pairings, or by sending a PGN or CBV file to **games AT MetroWestChess.org**. We especially encourage all players in the Open section to contribute their games to the club's collection.

If you turned in a game that you do not see in the collection, it is because either:

- * I haven't entered your score sheet yet. I'm working my way through a backlog of about 30 score sheets. (If you'd like to help out with game entry, please contact <address>.)
- * There was a problem with your score sheet. Roughly 15-20% of score sheets I receive are unusable because they are illegible or have illegal moves.

Be sure to try out the sets of games that are replay-able on-line, such as the annual yearbooks from 2004 and 2003.

And keep those score sheets coming. My goals are to eliminate the backlog by the end of the year and to update the games collection each month.







COMPETE :: Club Championship

The 2005 championship qualification cycle is three-quarters complete. Ilya Krasik jumped into 2nd place and Joesph Perl cracked the top 10 by virtue of their tie for first place in the Open section. A total of 51 players have earned qualification points Now both the class and club championship participants (6 in each event) will be chosen from this qualification list. The leaders based on nine months of play are as follows:

The 2005 Club Championship and the 2005 Class Championship events will be held in March 2005 as two closed 5-RR sections run in parallel with the normal monthly sections. The club championship participants will be the top six club members on the championship points list (who accept the invitation). The class championship participants will be the top six U2000 players remaining on the list (who accept the invitation). The USCF December 2004 rating list will be used to determine eligibility for the class championship.

Players earn points during the previous calendar year by placing 1st-2nd-3rd in the Open section, 1st-2nd in the Upper section, and 1st in the next highest section on a graduated scale based on the section level and number of rounds. In addition, bonus points are awarded for a perfect score. To qualify for the championship, players have to be club members and need to play in at least 4 events during the year.

COMPETE :: 2005 Tournament Schedule and New Class Championship Format

The 2005 tournament schedule has been posted on the Club website under the Future events link. While a few details still need to be ironed out, the schedule is essentially in final form. The biggest change in 2005 from 2004 is that the Class Championship (for U2000 players) will use the same round-robin format as the Club Championship. Highlights of the 2005 schedule:

- MCC will run 12 tournaments during the year, each starting on the first Tuesday of the month.
- 2. Tournaments will continue to offer 3 sections during 5-week events and 4 sections for the months that have 4-round tournaments. This format has served us well during the past 12 months where we have averaged 92 entries per month! As before, the section breaks will be staggered from month to month. Every breakpoint from 1200 to 1900 in increments of 50 appears at least once in the schedule.
- 3. The Club and Class Championships will be held in March 2005. However, next year the Class Championship will use the same format as the Club Championship. Both events will be contested in special 6-player sections using a 5-RR format (all play all) that will run in parallel with the regular Open, Upper, and Lower sections.
- 4. Players for both championships will qualify through the existing championship point system. The top 6 players from the list will be invited to play in the Club Championship. After the field is set, their names will be removed from the list and the top 6 players remaining whose rating is U2000 (according to the USCF December 2004 annual list) will be invited to the Class Championship. Any player rated U2000 who qualifies for the Club Championship will have a choice of playing in either the Club or Class Championship.
- 5. The total prize fund for the year has been modestly increased by approximately 3%.

COMPETE :: Team Email Match

For the third year in a row, MetroWest CC is engaged in an email match against the International Email Correspondence Club. The IECC is truly an international organization with well over 3000 members. In 2002 and 2003, the MetroWest CC teams split their two matches against the IECC. This year a MetroWest CC team of 5 palyers (Michael Barry, Eric Berkey, James Krycka, Jack Appelmans, and Jason Krienke) is playing an IECC team of ten players from 9 different countries (Australia, Brazil (2), France, Hong Kong, Italy, Netherlands, Peru, Poland, and USA). Each MetroWest CC player is pitted against one IECC player as white and one player as black.

The match started in June with a maximum time limit of 11 months. The IECC currently leads us one game to none. You can view the games (minus the last three moves for those in progress) home → Team Email Match → MCC-03 v IECC-84. The games will be updated this month.
