COMPETE :: Club Championship

The qualification cycle for the 2005 MCC Club Championship is now complete. IM Igor Foygel, who placed in 10 of this year's 12 events, has nearly quadruple-lapped the field with an amazing 756 points! Ilya Krasik with 6 placements, FM John Curdo with 9 placements, and John Chamberlain with 4 scoring events follow, each earning over 100 points. Trevor de Koekkoek and Alexander Paphitis nailed down the last two spots. Both are also eligible for the U2000 Class Championships and they may choose to play in either event. Bijan Haririan and Navan Ruthramoorthy are the first two alternates should any of the first 6 qualifiers decline to play in the Club Championship. Paphitis tied for 2nd place in the December Open section to move up two places into the final spot. He is the only qualifier to earn points in both Open and Class sections. Also of note was Mark Jo La Rocca's consistent performance in the Open section, placing 4 times. The top-10 qualifiers for the 2005 Club championship are as follows:

COMPETE :: Class Championship

Trevor de Koekkoek, the 2004 Class Champion, sits atop the final 2005 MCC Class Championship qualification standings. Runner-up is Alexander Paphitis. Both players also qualified for the Club Championship and they can choose to play in either event. Navan Ruthramoorthy, Joseph Francis, Calvin Hori, and George Goulding round out the top-6 places. Niki Konolvalchuk's sweep of the December U1800 section earned him 7th place.
