Annotated by George Mirijanian

Dunning, J - Curdo, J [A04]

Central New England Open Leominster, MA, 01.04.1979

1.Nf3 f5 2.e4 fxe4 3.Ng5 e5 4.d3 e3 5.Bxe3 Nc6 6.Be2 Nf6 7.0-0 Be7 8.f4 Nd5?? 9.Bh5+ g6 10.Nxh7! Kf7 (Diagram 1)

Curdo, in his book, Forty Years at the Top, wrote: "White has to be winning at this point. I'm not sure what he missed; I'll leave it to the reader to find." What White misses is 11. Qg4!, which should win in short order.

11...Nxe3 12.fxg6+ Ke6 13.Qf3 Nxf1 (Diagram 2)

14.Qf7+ Stronger seems 14.Nc3.




Diagram 1. After 10...Kf7



COMPETE:: Club and Class Championship Qualification As of End of September 2005

Three tournaments remain in the qualification cycle for the 2006 Club and Class Championships. The tie between David Harris and Jacob Wamala for 1st place in the September Open section moved Harris up two places to 4th on the club championship list and Wamala took over the 6th spot. This pushed James Rizzitano down two rungs to 7th place despite having gained a few points in the event. For the class championship, Neil Cousin's share of 1st place in September vaulted him into 5th place on the qualification list on tie breaks.
