HARRY NELSON PILLSBURY HISTORICAL GRAVE MARKER

The year 2006 marks the 100th anniversary of the death of the famous American player Harry Nelson Pillsbury. To commemorate this occasion, the Massachusetts Chess Association (MACA) has plans to place an historical marker on the grave of Pillsbury in Laurel Hill Cemetery in Reading, where the family plot is located. The grave site is an obelisk in the rear of the cemetery and has remained without care for many, many years. MACA would like to identify this grave site as the final resting place of Pillsbury, who was born Dec. 5, 1872, in Somerville, MA, and died June 17, 1906, in Philadelphia. He was the "Hero of Hastings" in 1895 and U.S. champion from 1897 until his untimely death at age 33. Funds are needed to pay for this grave marker and MACA wishes to solicit the members of the Metrowest Chess Club, without a doubt the largest and most successful club in New England -- if not the country -- to contribute toward this project. A ceremony unveiling of this grave marker in Laurel Hill Cemetery will take place on Saturday, June 17, at a time to be announced on the MACA Web site. Tax-deductible contributions may be made payable to MACA and sent to the Harry Nelson Pillsbury Historical Grave Marker Project, c/o Robert Messenger, MACA Treasurer, 4 Hamlett Dr, Apt. 12, Nashua, NH 03062. In addition, anyone donating at least \$35 can place Pillsbury's name on the list of individuals in the Living Memorial Chess Fund, which furnishes free chess sets to schools, libraries and junior chess clubs.

COMPETE:: Club and Class Championship Qualification As of End of January 2006

The January tournament kicked off the 2007 club and class championship qualification cycles. IM Igor Foygel and Larry Eldridge have the early lead in the two races.

Reviewing the last three qualification cycles, the average number of points needed to clinch 6th place for the club championship (and thus be guaranteed an invitation to the championship event) was 69. The actual numbers for 2004 through 2006 were 72, 60, and 74 points. To be in the top 6 for the U2000 class championship during the last two years required an average of 40 points as the 6th place finishers earned 39 and 40 points for these qualification cycles.
