A Witness to History

Marc LaRocca in the April 2006 Newsletter referred to Bobby Fischer's revival of the exchange variation of the Ruy Lopez. Fischer sprang the exchange variation for the first time on Lajos Portisch on November 10, 1966 at the 17th Olympiad held in Havana, Cuba. It turns out that I happened to be in the same room as Fischer during at least part of his preparation.

The occasion was that I was in the Manhattan Chess Club in New York City on a quiet afternoon in the mid 1960s. At that time the Club was located in the Henry Hudson Hotel on West 57th Street. When I entered the Club to play some off-hand 7 minute games I saw the well-accoutered Fischer (he was dressed in a fine suit and tie) intensely studying some old books taken from the usually-locked glass cabinet which housed such books. It turned out that he had asked Hans Kmoch, the Secretary of the Club, for the key to the cabinet. Curious, I asked Kmoch what was the reason for Fischer's somewhat unusual and rare appearance at the Club. Kmoch said that Fischer was interested in some old games of Steinitz and Lasker. It was later confirmed that Fischer's research on the exchange variation was partly done there on that afternoon.

Using the exchange variation Fischer defeated not only Portisch but also Gligorich and Jimenez at that Olympiad.

Mark asks what Fischer might have had prepared in response to

5. ... Bg4. I guess we'll never know because in his annotations to the Gligorich game in his "60 Memorable Games," after 6. h3 Fischer only discusses the reply 6. ... h5!
