Blitz Stars Battle GMs at Blackstone Chess Festival

The 2008 Blackstone Chess Festival features two top notch tournaments. The first is the New England Masters, where Grandmasters and Masters from ten different nations will compete. The Masters runs from Monday August 11, to Friday August 15, at Blackstone Chess Academy (the To Kalon Club), 26 Main Street, Pawtucket, RI. Live play by play will be shown in the lounge on the first floor, with master commentators.

Top seed is GM Leonid Kritz. Other top players include GM-elect Josh Friedel, GM Sergey Erenburg, GM Timur Gareev, GM Keith Arkell, IM Jacek Stopa, and Blitz All Stars Jorge Sammour-Hasbun and Denys Shmelov. Denys is also Metrowest and Massachusetts Champion. Two other local state champions will compete, Miro Reverby of RI and Braden Bournival of NH.

The opening ceremony is Monday Aug. 11, at 4 pm. Refreshments will be served. Round one of the New England Masters begins at 6pm. The Masters continues on Tuesday, and runs through Friday, with two rounds each day, one at 11 am, and one at 6pm. Time control is 40/90, followed by SD/30. Come watch the games and show your support for our local players vying for their IM and GM norms. The closing ceremony will be held Friday at 9pm.

Over the weekend players of all levels can take part in the Blackstone Chess Festival Open. This event is in two sections. The Open section is FIDE rated, and offers 50 Grand Prix points. It is open to players rated over 1600. The second section is U1900. Class prizes and youth prizes are offered in each section. The total prize fund is \$4000, \$3000 of which is guaranteed. Time control is 45/90, followed by SD/45.

The Festival Open takes place at the Comfort Inn, 2 George St., Pawtucket, RI, right off of I-95 exit 27. It is a 4 round Swiss. The schedule is: Sat. 11, 5, and Sun. 10:30, 4. Entry fee is \$75 in advance, \$85 at the door, IM/GM free.

Annotated Game Series – 2008 MCC Club Championship



This month features the round 3 struggle between Bennet Pellows and David Harris. Annotations by David Harris.





COMPETE: Club and Class Championship Qualification Standings Through July 2008

Except for Neil Cousin's rise from 9th to 2nd place in the Class Championships qualification standings, only minor adjustments occurred in the Club and Class standings as a result of July's tournament. Neil was the only player in all four sections to score more than 4 out of 5 points in his victory in the U2000 section. Denys Shmelov and Charles Riordan shared 1st place in the Open section and each improved their positions with Charles pushing John Curdo out of the top-6.
