U.S. NATIONAL CHESS CO-CHAMPION TO GIVE EXHIBITION IN FRAMINGHAM

International Grandmaster Roman Dzhindzichashvili will give a simultaneous exhibition in Framingham on Monday, February 6 at the American Legion hall, 11 Beech Street, at 7:30 PM. The exhibition will be sponsored by the Framingham Chess Club. In a simultaneous exhibition a master plays a large number of players at the same time. His opponents are arranged in a circle of chessboards, and the master proceeds around the circle, playing his move against each of his opponents. The other players ponder their reply in the time it takes the master to complete the circuit.

Grandmaster Dzhindzichashvili (pronounced JIN-jee-ASH-vee-lee) is currently a US National Chess Co-Champion, having tied for that title in July 1983 with Walter Shawn Browne and Larry Christiansen. Other major triumphs of his career include his victory in the powerful Hastings, England International in 1978 ahead of former World Champion Tigran Petrosian, and his win at Lone Pine, Nevada in 1980, the strongest Swiss-system tournament in the world. Dzhindzichashvili emigrated to the US from Soviet Georgia by way of Israel in the mid-1970s and currently makes his home in New York. He is currently the fourth-ranked player in the United States.

Any chess player may participate in the exhibition and play Grandmaster Dzhindzichashvili. A board fee of \$10 will be charged. Players are encouraged to bring their own sets and boards.
