## IM ZSUZSA POLGAR TO GIVE SIMULTANEOUS EXHIBITIONS IN BOSTON AND FRAMINGHAM

International Master Zsuzsa Polgar of Hungary, rated the number-one woman player in the world on the January 1985 FIDE rating list, will give 35-board simultaneous exhibitions sponsored by the Boylston and Framingham Chess Clubs in late October. Her appearances will be Friday, October 25 at 6:45PM at the Boylston Chess Club, and Saturday, Ocotber 26 at 1PM at the Framingham State College Center. The board fee will be \$25; boards may be reserved by contacting Rich Daly, 319 Columbia Street, Cambridge MA 02138, 576-2286 (Boylston Chess Club); or Warren Pinches, 115 Bay State Road #7, Boston MA 02215, 353-1889 (Framingham Chess Club). Polgar's Framingham exhibition will be preceded by a brief press conference at 12:30PM.

Rated 2430 at age 15, Polgar is the highest-rated player of either sex in her age group, and may become the first woman to challenge seriously the domination of chess by men. She is only one of four women ever to gain a men's International Master title. Outspoken in her criticism of women-only tournaments, she has sparked controversy in Hungay for refusing to play in the Women's World Championship cycle. Her auspicious entry into competitive chess was a portent for her spectacular career to date: at age <u>four</u>, she won an under-15 juniors tournament with a perfect score. A proficient linguist, Polgar speaks six languages fluently, including English.
