SARKISIAN AND BELTRAN TIE FOR 1985 CLUB CHAMPIONSHIP

Drew Sarkisian of Oxford and Alejandro Beltran of Wayland each scored an undefeated 5-1 in the Framingham Chess Club annual championship ending May 14, and were declared 1985 Co-Champions. Sarkisian received the championship trophy on tiebreak points. The two players drew with each other in the final round to each clinch a share of the title. Beltran had previously drawn Mike Johnson of Framingham, while Sarkisian had taken a half-point bye. Sarkisian, the second-seeded player in the field and a nationally-rated Expert, was a strong pre-tournament favorite. He had won three previous tournaments at the club including the prestigious Framingham Challenge Cup last August, and had tied for second in the 1984 Championship. Beltran, however, was a dark-horse, seeded tenth in the field; however his results had been improving by leaps and bounds thus far in 1985, having advanced him more than a full class in the rating system since January.

Tied for third with 4½-1½ were Bob Jordan of Upton, Craig Presson of Ashland, and Paul Heising of Ashland. Jordan, who won the first-under-1800 prize, was a huge surprise; his pre-tournament rating of 1594 ranked him only 17th in the field. His only loss was to Sarkisian. Presson had played impressively during the preceding six months, having won and tied for second in the two club tournaments in which he had played during that period. Heising, who had won five club tournaments in the preceding two years, had amassed enough cumulative tournament points in 1984 to be declared Player of the Year. Sharing sixth-seventh places with four points were top-seeded Expert Mike Lauziere of Oxford and Archie Woods of Natick. Roger Hecht of Brighton won the top-under-1600 award, with Larry Beatrice of Framingham top-under-1400.

Upsets abounded in the first round, four of them by more than four hundred rating points: Jonathan Warren of Framingham upended top-seed Lauziere, Heising fell to Syd Michael of Natick, Bob Engels of Framingham went down before the King's Gambit of John Gibbons of Upton, and John Vik of Maynard could only draw with Bob Matheson of Natick. The ranks of the leaders were thinned further in the second round when Presson drew with Joe Pineau of Natick and Sarkisian took a half-point bye. After three rounds only three players still had perfect scores: Beltran, Johnson, and Alyn Miller of Medway, who was returning to tournament play after a long absence. Beltran and Johnson drew in Round Four while Sarkisian beat Miller to join them at $3\frac{1}{2}$; Sarkisian pushed Johnson out of contention in Round Five while Beltran stunned Lauziere for a second time in the tournament. Beltran and Sarkisian were left a full point ahead of their pursuers going into the final round, and drew to share the title.

The 31-player field contained only two of the club's six experts, and regrettably defending 1984 champion Larry Williams of Worcester was unable to play. Warren Pinches directed.
