CURDO, SHAW TIE IN MARK BOND CLASSIC

John Curdo was held to a draw in the final round of the Mark Bond Classic on December 23 by Rob Huntington, allowing Alan Shaw, who defeated Jack Martin, to pull into a first-place tie at 5-1. Curdo had defeated Shaw in round 3; only Lou Mercuri kept pace with Curdo through round 3. Curdo and Mercuri agreed to a quick draw in round 4, both to escape an advancing blizzard and because Curdo knew Mercuri still had to play Shaw, who had edged back to a half-point off the pace with a win over Godov. It paid off for Curdo, as Shaw beat Mercuri in round 5 when Mercuri, in wild time-trouble and a wilder position, missed a forced win and wound up a rook down--and dropped out of the tournament. Meanwhile Curdo stayed ahead by downing Sarkisian, only to lose the lead in the final round. David Ferreira took clear third despite a slow start; he drew in round 1 with Stanley Crowe (rated 1394), and then took a half-point bye, before taking 31 from his last four games. Joe Pineau and Jorge Godoy shared the Under-2000 prize with 4-2, while David Cutler scored top Under-1750 with 4-2 and Stanley Crowe, top Under-1500 with 3½-2½. Also notable was 1369-rated Mark Steinberg's 3-3, which included draws with Huntington and Godoy-he was only stopped by Sarkisian in round 4. The tournament, the first-ever Grand Prix tournament ever held on a weeknight in New England, will become an annual event.

CURDO, CASSILAS SWEEP NEW YEAR'S SWISS

John Curdo and Adrian Cassilas each scored 4-0 to win the December 27 "All Sales Final" Swiss. Curdo ousted second-seeded William Kelleher in the final round, while Cassilas downed Allan Bennett. Kelleher, Edward Boudrot, John Loyte, Vesna Dimitrijevic, and Prabhu Raju shared third

The two drew each other in a Fajorowicz Budapest; Huntington won games as White with a Benko Gambit (castling-by-hand line) and an Evans Gambit, while Ferreira scored as Black in a Latvian Gambit and as White in a MacCutcheon French. Adam Devoe swept the Under-1850 section 3-0, playing a Danish Gambit, Kieseritsky King's Gambit, and a Marshall Gambit/Ruy Lopez.
