As I described in our phone conversation yesterday, the Framingham Chess Club wishes to stage a simultaneous exhibition in the Natick Mall sometime this fall. In a simultaneous exhibition, a prominent chess master plays a large number of amateurs (how ever many may sign up) all at once. It is an interesting spectacle for onlookers and an exciting experience for the participants. Such exhibitions have been held in the past at the Natick Mall.

We would like to hold such an event during September or October of this year. (If the idea is agreeable but your schedule does not permit it, we would like to be considered for inclusion in the 1984 schedule.) It would be a one-day affair--perhaps best on a Sunday. The exhibition would run about four hours. We believe we can obtain the services of one of the two Massachusetts co-champions, John Curdo or James Rizzitano, to conduct the exhibition.
